The suffering of the children due to the sloth and laziness of their parents pains my heart.

I am truly thankful for being able to hold these inaugural events after starting this mission work.

### \* Second Five-Year Plan of Paraguay Mission and sponsorship of scholarship students

This coming August marks the end of the first 5-year plan for the Paraguay missions, and we will be moving on to the second 5-year plan.

The <Hope Orphanage> and <Hope Free Boarding School>, which have not been accomplished in the first phase, will continue to be implemented after the renovation of the church building. I am going to start the renovation at the end of this year.

The Lord, who makes the entire Paraguayan capital ASUNCION, the residence of the poor, <Banado sur>, has been transformed by Christ, making sure that the whole country of Paraguay can be reborn. I realized that literacy and poverty eradication is a part of this ministry.

We are currently contributing \$30 a month for students who attend high school as scholarships. While we can only contribute to three children at this time, we pray and hope to support many more children in the future.

It is a tough task to promote academic achievements and encouraging children to learn how to balance academia and growing their faith. I pray that faith and academia lead a way out of poverty for these children.
