Thank you for your constant prayers and support. Our youth ministry has had a packed year filled with blessings. Our staff and ministry has been growing steadily. We even had two recent graduates return to serve the youth group while they're attending college. Our students are usually stressed out about school, but they've been growing a lot spiritually!



Aside from our weekly Sunday and Friday services, we had our first summer retreat as a ministry and our



first short-term mission trip to Guatemala. I invited a pastor friend from California to speak for us at the retreat. God used him to help our students to encounter God's love in a deeper way. Our Guatemala mission trip started out rough with several of our team members getting sick. However, we fought in prayer and it

ended up being a profound and powerful trip. We

preached the Gospel (through skits, testimonies and preaching) to several Guatemalan schools and churches and held VBS for the children. Many of our Illinois students were able to receive a bigger picture of the kingdom of God and to cultivate a greater heart to serve God and His people.





In addition to leading our youth group, I've been meeting monthly with local Christian club leaders from different schools. During our meetings, the students share what they've been doing in their respective clubs and we encourage each other and strategize to bring the Gospel to each campus. In April, they planned a revival night where they invited people from their schools and churches, including non-believers. Over 200 Junior High to High school students came and several responded to the Gospel! We also recently started working with an organization called National School Project to help mobilize more campus leaders to bring the Gospel to each school in the area.

able to finish all my degree requirements. I will be graduating in two weeks (Dec. 14)!
