Background

Context & Specific Need:

The aftermath of Typhoon Yagi has left the Mekong region in overwhelming need. The disaster, which struck in early September, has caused significant and widespread damage and loss of life. Vietnam, in particular, has been severely affected, with Hanoi and Ha Long Bay torn apart by high winds. Flash floods and landslides have also been triggered in Northern Thailand, Laos, and Myanmar. Each country in the Mekong region urgently seeks assistance to rebuild their homes and churches and provide immediate relief supplies such as water, food, medical, and repair supplies.

Vietnam's capital of Hanoi evaluated thousands of people living near the swollen Red River as its waters rose to a 20-year high, flooding streets days after Typhoon Yagi battered the country's north, killing at least 179 people.

Thailand: Heavy rain, floods, and landslides caused the worst flooding disaster in Chiang Rai and Maesai in northern Thailand. More than 50,000 households have been affected. Even electricity was cut for many days; therefore, people remained in shelters, and the disaster's impact continued to be felt.

Laos: Heavy rains forced hydropower plants to release water, leading to severe flooding in northern provinces. Over 32,000 people were affected, and the flooding significantly damaged schools, temples, homes, hospitals, churches, and farms. The Mekong River's water levels remained dangerously high, particularly near Luang Prabang and Vientiane.

Myanmar: After the landslide, the whole Thapyi Pen village was buried, with more than 700 people missing.

Nepal: the late flood came to Nepal and destroyed the roads and foundations of many buildings. The flood mainly caused a sinkhole near the OM Training Center in Kathmandu, swiped electrical poles and solar lights, and cracked the Training Center wall.

Brief Description:

OM Thailand plans to help those affected through local partners, such as Maesai Chinese Baptist church and Hannah Foundation, by focusing on the low-income families in villages nearby where our partners are located (50-100 houses). Local churches will reach out to low-income families during the transitional period when people need help and support with fixing and rebuilding. Hannah Foundation works for poor Myanmar refugees who primarily work in construction or have low wages (500-700 people).

Personnel in Vietnam seek to provide aid in food, water, and medical supplies to those affected to build relationships with local people and meet immediate needs. There will be an excellent rebuilding need as the weather will get cold and harsh as the year ends. And collaborate with local Christian NGOs and church denominations to support the damage done to the Hanoi and Ha Long Bay area.

Personnel in Laos is exploring how to communicate with local churches and Christian NGOs and

collect more information to plan the aids. The government is currently handling recovery efforts, and the larger registered NGOs are meeting this week to discuss plans.

Activities

Food distribution for those who lost everything in Mekong region.

We aim to distribute food and medical packs to those in three countries through local churches and NGOs.
